CALL FOR APPLICATION FOR THE ERASMUS+ MOBILITY GRANT FOR THE PARTICIPATION TO ERASMUS+ BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAMME (BIP) SPARK SOCIAL AT UNIVERSITY OF ICELAND, REYKJAVIK (ICELAND)

The call for applications is hereby published to receive mobility grants to participate to the Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) **"Spark Social. Your knowledge benefits the world".** The course, promoted by the University of Iceland, will take place from **8.2.2024** to **17.5.2024**.

BIPs are short-term Intensive Study Programs that include both in-person and online attendance. The selected students must attend all the online sessions and guarantee at least 5 days in presence. In the case of the "Spark Social" course, the activities will be carried out online in several sessions from **8.2.2024** to **10.5.2024**, while in-presence activities will take place from **13.5.2024** to **17.5.2024** at the University of Iceland in Reykjavik (Iceland).

All the activities will be held exclusively in English; thus knowledge of the English language is required. Students that will complete the programme (virtual and physical mobility – both mandatory) will receive **6** ECTS.

The call, having a deadline on **January 26, 2024** is addressed to students who, at the moment of the application, are regularly enrolled in one of the Master courses of the University of Naples Federico II and have been accepted to participate at the **Spark Social**.

2. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Selection Committee will select **8** students for grants. Applicants should be regularly enrolled at Federico II for the a.y. 2023/24.

3. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Interested students should apply by the deadline **January 26, 2024**, sending the following documents by e-mail (<u>aurora.f2@unina.it</u>):

- Curriculum Vitae (including a list of exams/grades passed/obtained so far in the Master course they're enrolled in);

- Motivational letter in English (max 250 words);

- English language certificate (not required for those students already enrolled in a Master officially taught in English).

ALL the documents must be sent in one single pdf file.

In case of incomplete or inaccurate documentation, the application will be rejected.

4. SELECTION CRITERIA

- Max. 50 points for the evaluation of the student's academic career.
- Max. 30 points for the way student CV and expertise are suited to the premises, methods, and objectives of the "Spark Social" course.
- Max. 20 points for the motivational letter, concerning:
- specific training objectives of the participation in the "Spark Social" course
- potential impact of participation on student's studies
- acquisition of specific and/or transversal skills.

The selection is the sole responsibility of the Evaluation Committee, which is composed by the following members:

4. PUBLICATION OF RESULTS

The final list of students admitted to the funding will be published on the Aurora website on **February 7**, **2024**.

5. FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

The selected students will be financially supported according to the norms of the Erasmus+ Programme. The financial contribution is established as follows:

Duration of in-person mobility:	Amount
Until the 14th day of activity	79 euro / day
From the 15th day to the 30th day of activity	56 euro / day

A one-time-only extra amount of $100 \in$ to the individual support of the EU contribution for an in-person mobility from 5 to 14 days, or $150 \in$ for an in-person mobility from 15 to 30 days, is also available for students with fewer opportunities, with ISEE < $\leq 15,000$ used for university purposes as submitted by the Erasmus grant winners for their latest enrolling. Students that will choose a "green" travel solution will receive another extra amount of $50 \in$ one-time-only.

Further information about the financial contribution will be provided to the students that will be selected for this programme.

Erasmus+ contributions are related to the activities abroad and to the recognition of such activities by the University. Students that will not complete all the steps will have to return the whole amount of the contribution.

6. DATA PROCESSING

Information on the processing of personal data pursuant to art. 13 of Regulation (EU) 679/2016 laying down rules on the processing of personal data and the code regarding the protection of personal data, Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 supplemented and amended by Legislative Decree No. 101/2018

By filling in, delivering, and transmitting the forms required for participation in this selection notice, the student provides his personal data to the University of Naples Federico II and assumes the quality of "interested party" to the processing of such data pursuant to of the art. 4, 1) of the EU Regulation.

PURPOSES AND MEANS OF PROCESSING: The personal data provided during the application for participation or acquired subsequently during the relationship with the University will be processed for institutional purposes, in particular for administrative and accounting obligations related to the agreement. To this end, personal data such as name, surname, residence, personal data, tax code, contact details, address, email, data relating to the qualifications held, to the school career may be collected.

Personal data will be processed by authorised personnel both electronically, through the computerized management of the data, and in paper mode, through the collection, storage and use of documents in files, dossiers, and archives.

MANDATORY PROVISION OF DATA AND CONSEQUENCES OF ANY REFUSAL: the processing of personal data is mandatory for the purpose of assessing the requirements for participation in the aforementioned call. Particular categories of data (judicial data and particular state of health) are provided voluntarily to allow the University to carry out the procedure and/or the provision of the related services for participation. For these reasons, consent to the processing of data is not required. Any refusal will make it impossible for the University to fulfil these purposes and participation in the program.

COMMUNICATION AND DISSEMINATION OF DATA: Personal data will be processed for the performance of institutional activities according to the principles of lawfulness, necessity, non-excess, relevance and correctness, in accordance with European and national legislation and the University Regulations on the subject; the data may be disclosed in particular to the following subjects (Erasmus+ National Agency - INDIRE; European Commission, Ministry of Education, University and Research; University; Host company; Affiliated banking institution).

In compliance with the provisions on Transparent Administration (Legislative Decree No. 33/2013 and subsequent amendments) personal data, except for the particular categories – referred to in articles 9 and 10 of the EU Regulation – are disseminated through publication on the university's institutional website for the period provided for by law.

RIGHTS OF THE INTERESTED PARTY: At any time the student may exercise his rights pursuant to articles 15-22 and 77 of the EU Regulation, where the conditions are met.
